ELIGIBILITY: Open to all musicians born, residing or studying in the state of Colorado as of September 1, 2008. Applicants must be no older than 22 as of April 1, 2009.

APPLICATIONS: Must be completed and returned with proof of age, brief biography and a check for \$40 (non-refundable entry fee) made payable to the Boulder Philharmonic Orchestra, postmarked by November 10, 2008. A confirmation will be mailed upon receipt of the application.

REPERTOIRE CRITERIA: One movement of a concerto or concert piece for solo instrument or voice and orchestra. Selection must be memorized and will be used for both the audition and performance by competition winner on January 18, 2009.

AUDITIONS: Auditions will be held on December 6, 2008 (9am-5pm) at the Parlando School for the Arts at the Dairy Center for the Arts, 26th and Walnut Streets in Boulder, Colorado. Accompanists must be provided by the applicant. Decisions made by judges and competition committee are final. All auditions are closed to the public.

WINNERS: Three winners (first, second and third place) will be chosen to receive an honorarium of \$1000, \$500 and \$250 respectively. The first place winner will be invited to perform during the Boulder Philharmonic Orchestra performance on January 18, 2009 at Macky Auditorium in Boulder, Colorado.

Each season the orchestra features great masterpieces, exciting new works and prominent guest artists, including Itzhak Perlman, Yo-Yo Ma, Jessye Norman, James Galway, Frederica Von Stade, Sarah Chang and many others. The Boulder Philharmonic Orchestra also has a strong commitment to education.
